Participants are encouraged to share their own perspectives and approaches so all may benefit from the experiences of the group.

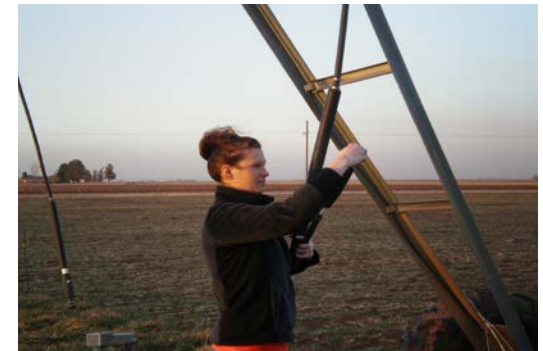
